Self-Assessment

This document outlines the questions to be answered for the range registration process. This document is only for gathering the information, all range registrations must be completed online. Paper copies are not accepted.

○ Range Registration Details

This question determines certification. If you have a dispensation you will need to give us a copy. If you do not comply, a range assessor can visit, just like a Judge used to do.

Those clubs that own or lease their facility may be eligible for funding from national Sports Councils. We can support these clubs to write funding applications.

By knowing the landlords we can open discussions nationally with umbrella organisations and aid clubs locally where necessary.

Next Steps

- If the ranges complies with the Rules of Shooting, once completion of the self-assessment you will receive a certificate. Re-assessment takes place after 3 years.
- If the range has a current dispensation and you have a copy, you will be asked to send that into the office. It will be checked, and as long as no changes have occurred since the dispensation was issued, you will then receive a certificate.
- If the range does not comply, you will have to arrange a site visit. Please refer to the website for further information on this – www.archerygb.org/rangeassessors. A site visit can only be booked once when you have completed the online version.
