



How to make a nomination for a GWAS award

The GWAS Awards Panel invites members of GWAS to submit nominations for awards at Regional level. Details of the types of award are listed on the nomination form (see link below).

Regional nomination forms should be submitted to the GWAS Hon. Secretary any time in the period from after the AGM until 30th September. We would also be grateful if you would email an unsigned copy to secretary@gwas.org.uk as well, in case of loss in the post.

Nominations for GWAS awards

Nominations should be made using the GWAS Annual and Lifetime awards nomination form which can be found on the GWAS website in the Council/documents/forms and logos - annual and lifetime awards).

Anyone may make a nomination, but the proposer will need to state: the name of the nominee; their club; their county; their AGB number; a written statement of why they are worthy of an award (in 100 words or less); the name of a seconder.

Nominations should be sent to the GWAS Hon. Secretary, who will forward the information to the Awards Panel Chairman and send an acknowledgement of receipt. Potential recipients will not be informed that they have been nominated.

GWAS Awards Process

After the closing date of 30th September, the nominations for a Regional awards will be made available to the GWAS Awards Panel for consideration. Awards recommended by the Awards Panel will be notified to Council and will be approved without debate unless some matter is known to be directly prejudicial to the good standing of the recipient.

The recommended list of GWAS awards is to be disclosed to the Council at the January meeting prior to the AGM. Once approved by Council, intended recipients will be notified by the Hon. Secretary, and awards will be presented by the President at the AGM.

Who is on the Awards Panel?

The GWAS Council determined that the Awards Panel should consist of:

- One member from each constituent county, that member being one of the two representatives nominated to council in a given year. Each county decides which of its representatives will sit on the panel and the choice to be ratified by the GWAS Council.
- The panel should be chaired by the GWAS President, who will have a casting vote.
